





REPORT OF THE 116th ONTARIO STATE CONVENTION

APRIL 26-28, 2019 NIAGARA FALLS, ONTARIO.

The Election of Officers to the State Board for the jurisdiction of Ontario for 2019-2020

State Deputy – David Peters

State Secretary- Marcel Lemmen defeated Nam Tang

State Treasurer- Bruce Poulin

State Advocate- David Gelinias

State Warden- Joe Bodnar defeated Martin Marko. Henry Tang withdrew.

RESOLUTIONS were passed:

- to limit the maximum terms of office for the Financial Secretary to nine consecutive years.
 - to encourage the sponsorship of a “Child through Chalice”.
 - to officially recognize “Knights on Bikes” in Ontario.
 - to defend freedom of speech, assembly, conscience and religion in Canada.
 - to eliminate discriminatory practices in the Canada summer jobs applications.
 - to oppose Canada’s international funding of abortions, a sum of 650 million dollars.
 - to oppose the Government’s support of 4500 annual deaths by euthanasia because of the \$1200 per day cost for hospital care for dying patients.
 - A resolution to eliminate dues for serving Military Personnel and in addition to excuse all veterans from annual dues was tabled until next year. Supreme is in the process of making a decision on this very same issue.
- The move to The Sheraton on The Falls Hotel, Niagara Falls was inevitable. The contract with the previous Hotel in Mississauga expired and since the Knights were unable to meet the agreed attendance of 720 people (357 at the State Banquet) the Knights were required to pay the difference. (over \$20,000) . The move to Niagara Falls made everything extremely expensive and for your two Delegates it is our last convention.

SAINT OF THE MONTH

St. Damien Feast Day May 10

When Joseph de Veuster was born in Tremelo, Belgium, in 1840, few people in Europe had any firsthand knowledge of leprosy (also known as Hansen's disease). By the time he died at the age of 49, people all over the world knew about this disease because of him. They knew that human compassion could soften the ravages of this disease.

Forced to quit school at age 13 to work on the family farm, Joseph entered the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary six years later, taking the name of a fourth-century physician and martyr. When his brother Pamphile, a priest in the same congregation, fell ill and was unable to go to the Hawaiian Islands as assigned, Damien quickly volunteered in his place. In May 1864, two months after arriving in his new mission, Damien was ordained a priest in Honolulu and assigned to the island of Hawaii. In 1873, he went to the Hawaiian government's leper colony on the island of Moloka'i, set up seven years earlier. Part of a team of four chaplains taking that assignment for three months each year, Damien soon volunteered to remain permanently, caring for the people's physical, medical, and spiritual needs. In time, he became their most effective advocate to obtain promised government support. Some people thought Damien was a hero for going to Moloka'i and others thought he was crazy. During this time, he taught the Catholic faith to the people of Hawaii. Father Damien also cared for the patients himself and established leadership within the community to build houses, schools, roads, hospitals, and churches. He dressed residents' ulcers, built a reservoir, made coffins, dug graves, shared pipes, and ate with his hands with them, providing both medical and emotional support. After eleven years caring for the physical, spiritual, and emotional needs of those in the leper colony, Father Damien realized he had also contracted leprosy when he was scalded by hot water and felt no pain. He continued with his work despite the infection but finally succumbed to the disease on 15 April 1889. Father Damien was canonized by Pope Benedict XVI October 11 2009
